WAY AND MEANS/PUBLICITY

Nancy and I removed all the art work from Solid Grounds (SG) and moved many of the smaller pieces to the Highlands Ranch Library for display. We received very positive feedback and compliments from the SG management as well as patrons about our display during March.

As a reminder if you would like to display any small pieces For Sale or Not for Sale we have two display cases through May at the Highlands Ranch Library. Just to recap there isn't a rental fee; however Owner donation to the library is encouraged from the sale of artwork on display. Suggested donation is 10% of sale price. We ask that you provide easels or stands. If you choose to sell please mark with your name, price and contact information (using a business card works great. Proceeds from any sold pieces can be kept by the owner or all/portion can be donated to the chapter or library. Display only items should be marked with your name and NFS (Not for Sale). Additionally, if you would provide an inventory list of your pieces it is helpful for tracking purposes. Thanking you in advance for sharing your art. We look forward to show casing the beautiful pieces and the library patrons enjoy admiring your work.



Please contact either Nancy Glassman or me if you have any pieces readily available that you would like to display and we'll arrange getting them. We would love to change up the displays, if possible, over the two months giving everyone an opportunity to share their paintings.

The Chapter Brochure was completed, printed and shared at the April Board meeting. It will be distributed at the 2016 Bead Bazaar, April 29-30, where we will have a booth. This is a large event and a great avenue to share the word about who we are and what we do as an organization. We are hopeful that the brochure will provide awareness, peak interest in our chapter and be a useful publicity tool in acquiring new members.
