# **Do Colors Influence People?**

Can you imagine if there was no color on the Internet (yikes)? All websites were a mixture of black, white and different shades of grey? Not interesting and fun! Colors on the web or in our painting have many functions. Color can make a design interesting, eye catching, and even influence what we think of them just to name a few.

Tip (from years ago, but still applies today):

I've done lots of furniture that was painted or varnished. If it was really old and dirty, I would wash it first, dry and then sand. I used Kilz spray primer/sealer on all of it and then painted a base coat over that. The spray was the fastest way to go. You can get it at any home improvement store. I did this for many clients and have had great luck, never had paint chip and no complaints. If the paint finish was rough or cracked, I used DecoArt Weathered Wood on it to give it a shabby chic look. To do this, spray with Kilz, base coat the color you want showing through the cracks, brush on weathered wood. Follow label directions. Then brush on top coat color. Any design by Ros Stallcup, with all her florals, was always a popular choice. Kathy Swigon, CDA
