Hello Everyone,

First, I want to **thank everyone** who attended the Chris Thornton's seminar! We had a great time that weekend. I hope you all enjoyed the seminar and learned a great deal in the process. Also, thank you all for bringing all that wonderful food! Lunches were delicious! For those of you who couldn't attend I will bring your pattern packet and stencils to our next meeting.... so sorry you couldn't attend.

Here is a tip from DecoArt:

Q: How long must I wait to take my Patio Paint Outdoor project outside? A: Your piece can go outside once you've finished painting. However, we suggest that it not be exposed to moisture for 72 hours. Until 72 hours passes, you should bring it indoors if it looks like rain or before the overnight dew falls.

I have been receiving newsletters from "The Brush Guys" and maybe you have too. They are the home of the \$2.00 brush. I visited their website (surprise!) and found they have how-to videos for brush uses. I noticed they carry many different types of brushes and worth the time to look around their website. Their newsletters have lots of very good sales. This past week the sale was on travel brushes that pull apart... where were these when I needed them. *grin*

Della Wetterman announced her plans to bring back Joyce Howard's patterns. Della has been working with Joyce's daughter and updating directions, supplies and paint colors. Joyce passed away in the 1980's, but her work will be very welcomed today. I have known about this for some time, but couldn't tell you! If you still use spray varnish here are some tips:

1. Shake the can very well... then do it some more! The better you mix it up the better your spray will be.

2. Begin to spray OFF of the surface you are going to apply the primer/paint/varnish to. Then allow the can to lightly glide over the surface continuing to press the spray nozzle as you move over and off the surface again. Make sure you are no closer than 8 inches from the surface as you spray or you will get those thick areas.

3. Turn the surface if needed and repeat until there is a very thin layer on the entire surface.

4. Let this very thin layer to dry about five minutes or until you can touch it gently and not leave a mark.

5. Turn the can upside down and press the spray nozzle until only clear air comes out. This will only take a few moments to do. (this keeps the nozzle clear so it won't clog up)

6. Repeat the above steps to add another thin layer of material to the surface. Be sure to allow a little more time for this layer to dry since it will tend to soften the first layer.7. Repeat the above steps as often as needed to get the solid even coverage you desire.
