June Strokework Program

After Marilyn Corners warms us up with the strokework on our slates we started at the May program, we will paint a 3" wood ornament with a strokework flower. We will apply the same steps as Marilyn uses, base coat, float and strokes.

The patterns from which you may choose are on the last page this newsletter so that you may bring brushes that will fit these small flowers. For Rosemaling you will find that filberts in sizes #2, 4 and 6 will work well, or you may have some small flats or brights in #2, 4 or 6. Small rounds #0, 1, 2 or 10/0 and a good liner will also help you be successful. Bring your normal acrylic painting supplies - paper towel, small palette, brush cleaner, water container, scissors, stylus and white or black transfer paper.

There are 3 backgrounds from which to choose: Lt. Ivory, Deep Teal and Midnight Blue.

I'll have the acrylic paints, patterns and some brushes for you to use if you don't have some small enough.

You should have a finished ornament to take home. If you have some small paint cups for paint to take home to finish, please bring them.

Rosemaling is traditional Norwegian painting emphasizing the use of strokes as most of the Nordic countries use. There are 5 surviving styles from Norway as it used to be that each area of the country had their own style developed by the local artists to decorate the home interiors and bowls or plates. Most styles have been lost. The three most common styles today are Rogaland, Telemark and Hallingdahl. These use a C, U, Oval, Circle, Comma, Teardrop and Scrolls.

Come and have fun completing your slate and an ornament!

Numerous beautiful fabric pieces including a brush holder, a CD of the 40th Anniversary SDP lessons which may be borrowed and a tote bag were displayed. Pieces from the classes they took were shown along with photos of the table decorations, table placemats, scarves, center pieces, and a hand painted book for Board Members. The painted pieces were really beautiful!

Melinda Barnes brought back a pen, SDP Battery Power Blank, and a beverage container. There was a raffle of painted items and a Silent Auction of a number of items.

A New Certification Level has been added as 'Entry Level Accredited Decorative Painter' of 7 elements (sampler) or stroke pattern to encourage more participation.

There were 89 entries in the Certification program with 55 from Japan and 1 new MDA from Japan. There was one passing CDA from the USA.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 PM to paint the slate with Marilyn Corners - value change is the objective.

Glue: Have you ever wondered what kind of glue works best for the projects you are working on? I listed some of the most popular glues available and their uses found on a website called LemonJitters.com.

E6000 Multi-Purpose Adhesive

It glues all kinds of things together and easy to use. You might have to cut your tube open at some point - it's difficult to keep the top from clogging. Use it for metal or plastic or small wood pieces. If you want to make jewelry, this is your best friend. Once dry, the bond can't be broken easily.

Aleene's Original Tacky Glue

A very popular glue. Tacky glue is good for fabrics such as felt, cotton, putting sequins on fabric, etc.

Gorilla Glue:

Good for wood, metal, foam, glass, ceramics... all heavy materials. It is very, very strong. Downside is it doesn't dry clear and expands a bit as it dries.

Scotch Advanced Tape Glider or Xyron Tape Runner:

Tape runners are fun. Easy and clean to use. Good for paper projects.

Mod Podge Matte or Mod Podge Gloss:

Mod Podge is a must-have these days. It's an adhesive and a sealant which is fantastic. Mod Podge is good for collaging, with paper and even with fabric to hard surfaces like collaging fabric onto an art canvas. In Chicago I saw Mod Podge at the Dollar Store!

Mini Glue Gun:

Glue guns are handy because they are easy to use, adhere to fabric and are only semi-permanent. Low-temp was a great invention so I don't burn myself, as bad. *grin*

Glue Dots:

Easy to use. Similar to the tape runners, only in smaller sizes. Good for paper projects.

Elmer's No-Wrinkle Rubber Cement:

This is toxic smelling, so be careful when using it. It's good for school projects and paper crafts. It has a fairly strong hold but it's not permanent.

There is a new **blog** called "Little Big Brushes" by the very talented ladies at Art Apprentice Online. There are several wonderful projects such as drawing and tips for painting a stroke rose by my favorite rose artist, Sue Abdella. There are tutorials and videos. Definitely worth the time to check this out!

The Color Purple:

Purple is a rarity in nature and the expense of creating the color has given purple a supernatural aura for centuries. Purple is the most powerful wavelength of the rainbow! The origins of the symbolism of purple are more significant than those of any other color. If we go back to our pre-historic existence, our ancestors probably never saw a purple fruit, flower, or any living thing because purple is very rare in nature. Earliest purple dyes date back to about 1900 B.C. It took 12,000 shellfish to extract 1.5 grams of the pure dye... barely enough for dyeing a single garment. This color was used primarily for garments of the emperors or privileged individuals. Over time purple pigments and dyes became less costly and complex. One thing has remained the same, purple symbolizes nobility and luxury to most people in the world. Purple tends to be a color that people either love or hate. Purple is not a common flag color, only two flags contain purple.
