June Strokework Program

We will paint a 3” wood ornament with a strokework flower. We will apply the same steps as Marilyn uses, base coat, float and strokes.

The patterns from which you may choose are on the last page this newsletter so that you may bring brushes that will fit these small flowers. For Rosemaling you will find that filberts in sizes #2, 4 and 6 will work well, or you may have some small flats or brights in #2, 4 or 6. Small rounds #0, 1, 2 or 10/0 and a good liner will also help you be successful. Bring your normal acrylic painting supplies - paper towel, small palette, brush cleaner, water container, scissors, stylus and white or black transfer paper.

There are 3 backgrounds from which to choose: Lt. Ivory, Deep Teal and Midnight Blue.

I'll have the acrylic paints, patterns and some brushes for you to use if you don't have some small enough.

You should have a finished ornament to take home. If you have some small paint cups for paint to take home to finish, please bring them.

Rosemaling is traditional Norwegian painting emphasizing the use of strokes as most of the Nordic countries use. There are 5 surviving styles from Norway as it used to be that each area of the country had their own style developed by the local artists to decorate the home interiors and bowls or plates. Most styles have been lost. The three most common styles today are Rogaland, Telemark and Hallingdahl. These use a C, U, Oval, Circle, Comma, Teardrop and Scrolls.

Tips for painting spider webs from Peggy Harris (with permission)

"Spray the otherwise finished painting with matte acrylic sealer before painting webs (Krylon 1311 or Folk Art ClearCote). The resulting sealed/slick surface will allow you to correct any problems with your web without disturbing the underlying painting! Fill a script liner (for best control) full of paint slightly thinned with water. Wipe away excess paint on the palette... the full load is needed to place the paint in the belly of the brush so it will flow freely... wiping away excess paint ensures a fine point on the brush.

Allow the paint to flow from the brush using NO pressure. Correct and 'shave' thick lines with the chisel of a damp clean bright (flat) brush. You can often 'clean up' a line better than you can paint it!

I like to over paint webs with Jo Sonja's Opal Dust for a subtle 'halogen' effect."

Here again is your supply list for the Saturday October 17 class with Renee Jorgenson.

- Graphite pencil, pencil sharpener, white erasure.
- Watercolor pencils: main colors:
 - Scarlet Red,
 - Ochre Yellow,
 - Ultramarine Blue,
 - Emerald Green and
 - Violet, and any additional colors you like to work with.
 - Recommended brands: Caran d"arche Supracolor, Prismacolor, or Derwent.
- Bring your regular colored pencil set.
- 2 Black Pigma Micron pens: .005 and one with a thicker line.
- Gelly Roll pen: gold
- Good quality watercolor paint brushes: 00 and 0 round (good points important)
- Spoon burnishing tool (several will be provided)
- Water container
- Paper Towels
- 12 inch ruler

Renee will provide individual packets with samples of designs to choose from, tracing paper, watercolor paper, burnishing film, gold ink, gouache, reference materials, and giclees of her personal works. There is a \$3.00 charge for these supplies.

The class time is 9:30 to 3:30 with lunch included.

I look forward to show casing the beautiful pieces and I know the library patrons enjoy admiring your work.

One thing I'm considering is having a Craft/Art Garage Sale in the spring where everyone can purge items they no longer use or need (we always seem to be over stuffed, right?) so I know we can come up with more than just art items.
