Painting Tip from Tracy Moreau (sharing with permission)

Sealing surfaces is always a hot point.

I usually seal NEW wood surfaces with All purpose sealer or Decoart Decoupage. I use a seal and first base coat trick that is a great time saver!! I mix All purpose sealer, or decoart Decoupage with equal amounts of my base color. I apply it generously and smooth it out to remove brush marks. Allow it to dry well, then sand it lightly to remove any burrs or furring. Then apply a second coat of the same mixture. Let it dry well. Sand lightly once again. If another coat of the color is need apply one coat of just the acrylic paint.

I prefer to seal MDF Surface with a coat of Gesso, let it dry then sand lightly. Older surfaces (reclaimed furniture, old finishes or unknown finishes) I prefer to seal with a stain blocker, usually 2 coats letting each one dry before reapplying. I then let it dry for 24 to 48 hours before I begin painting. It is incredibly frustrating to have old stain or varnish leach color through your hard work.

For Metal, thoroughly clean the surface with a good grease cutting soap (dawn works great) and Hot water. Brush off any loose rust. Let it dry well. Apply two coats of DecoArts Metal Primer, letting each coat dry well before reapplying. Let it dry 24 hrs. This primer will Block rusting. Works right over Rusted surfaces.

Painting Tip:

Have trouble getting your graphite to transfer clearly??

Try taking a hair dryer to the surface you are transferring to, just for a minute or two.

A surface that is still a little damp or freshly painted, (even one that has been sitting overnight) will be harder to transfer to than one that is completely dry. A couple of minutes under the heat of the hair dryer and the remaining moisture will be gone, making it much easier to trace and transfer your design.

Painting Tip: When painting with Metallics... to get a nice uniform finish, apply the paint in one direction only, overlapping each stroke slightly. This will help arrange the metallic partials and create a smooth metallic look. Tracy Moreau - <u>https://tracymoreau.net/</u>

WET Palettes... Homemade WET Palettes - Today's discussion refers to a wet palette made with a sponge substitute and paper in a container.

(Shop towels with paint wells created in the damp towels are a holding palette and while very good for keeping paint moist, do not allow you to mix on the palette, etc. They are acceptable for some., but not all, techniques. If unsure, use a real wet palette with sponge/paper.)1. Select a lidded container. Shallow plasticware works well.

 Place a sponge substitute in the bottom of the container. Real chamois, synthetic chamois or things like ShamWow work well. Also good is a thick bed of 3-4 Viva paper towels folded under to FIT the bottom of the container.

3. Fill the sponge substitute with as much water as it can possibly hold. Do not squeeze out the water. Simply tip the container to allow excess to run off.

4. Place a piece of deli-wrap on the "sponge" base. Select deli wrap that has LITTLE to NO WAX on it - the moisture must be able to soak through the paper in order to reach the paint!

5. CUT off or FOLD under any paper that extends beyond the "sponge" base!!!!!!!!!

6. I repeat: CUT off or FOLD under any paper that extends beyond the "sponge" base!!!!!!!!! Paper extending out beyond the "sponge" base is the single greatest flaw I see in homemade wet palettes since it immediately begins to suck dryness into the palette at a rate that not even the wettest palette can withstand!
7. Smooth the paper against the "sponge" base to eliminate as much air as possible that may be lurking between the surfaces.

8. Blot excess water from the surface with a paper towel.9. Keep the palette closed when not in use.
